Piaget described a two-stage process of moral development. 3 Kohlberg extended Piaget's theory, proposing that moral development is a continual process that occurs throughout the lifespan. His theory outlines six stages of moral development within three different levels.

Lawrence Kohlberg was inspired by Jean Piaget's work on moral judgment to create a stage theory of moral development in childhood. The theory includes three levels and six stages of moral thinking. Each level includes two stages. The levels are called preconventional morality, conventional morality, and postconventional morality. Since it was initially proposed, Kohlberg's theory has been criticized for overemphasizing a Western male perspective on moral reasoning.

Kohlberg began work on this topic while being a psychology graduate student at the University of Chicago in 1958 and expanded upon the theory throughout his life.
